Good Showers in Many Places in This Area

Rain, accompanied in some places by small hail, fell in Otter Tail County late Wednesday afternoon and last night. As in the past, Fergus Falls received only a very light shower, .08, according to Jos. W. Felix, the official government weather observer for Fergus Falls.

Heaviest rain reported to the Journal this forenoon was at Parkers Prairie where Mrs. Hans Schroeder, Journal correspondent reported 1.75 of an inch, most of which fell in less than half an hour, reaching cloud-burst proportions.

Wadena had another inch, that village having had 1.21 inches on Monday of this week, and ten days ago approximately an inch. Deer Creek, according to Mrs. C. E. Stewart, Journal correspondent, received additional moisture last night bringing to 1.50 inches the total fall for the past two days.

Evansville had .63 of an inch according to the gauge at the Carl Erickson place. Alexandria had .34 at the same time. The Leaf Lakes, north of Henning, received 1.25 inches, but the village of Henning had only .30 according to the Consumers Oil Co. gauge.

The New York Mills area, which has been so dry, welcomed a half inch, according to the Farmers Elevator gauge. Perham received the first rain since the last of June .20 in the village, according to R. A. Beitz' gauge, while some of the surrounding areas reported as much as an inch.

There was a good shower reported in the Pickrel Lake area. Maine township which has been very dry heretofore, and also in Amor. The north side of Otter Tail Lake, west of Pleasure Park reported almost an inch, while the village of Ottertail had only .20.

Scott said Lindeburg was fishing Wednesday with a steel pole and was barefooted. Scott wore rubber hip boots. As Scott started to leave the beach the bolt struck.

"All of a sudden I was knocked down and it felt as if my hair was frying, sort of sizzling," he said. "When I got up I wasn't hurt, just shaken."
